Year 8 Geography Field Trip

Year 8 Geographers conducted primary data collection at three sites in the River Stort last week. The aim was to test Bradshaw's model, to establish whether the River Stort has the typical characteristics of a river in the middle course, and whether the expected changes were seen along the course of the river. Students measured the width, depth and velocity of the river, and analysed the size and shape of stones on the riverbed. They are now working on and evaluating their findings. We were very proud of how the students conducted themselves, and we are grateful to Bishop's Stortford Town Council for their permission and encouragement to conduct this fieldwork, and for the provision of resources.
